
- **What they are:** email alerts showing all the articles from the latest issue of a journal.

Updates on a specific research topic

- **What they are:** regular alerts based on the results of an evidence search, eg on Medline or CINAHL
- **Why use them?:** if you have a very specific interest, run a search and save it as an alert. You'll receive articles on a narrow research topic from a wide range of journals
- **How they work:** when you run a database search, choose "save and create alert" to receive automatic updates to the results at regular intervals
- **We'll do it for you!** We carry out evidence searches on request for most purposes. When you request a search let us know if you'd like to receive regular updates.
